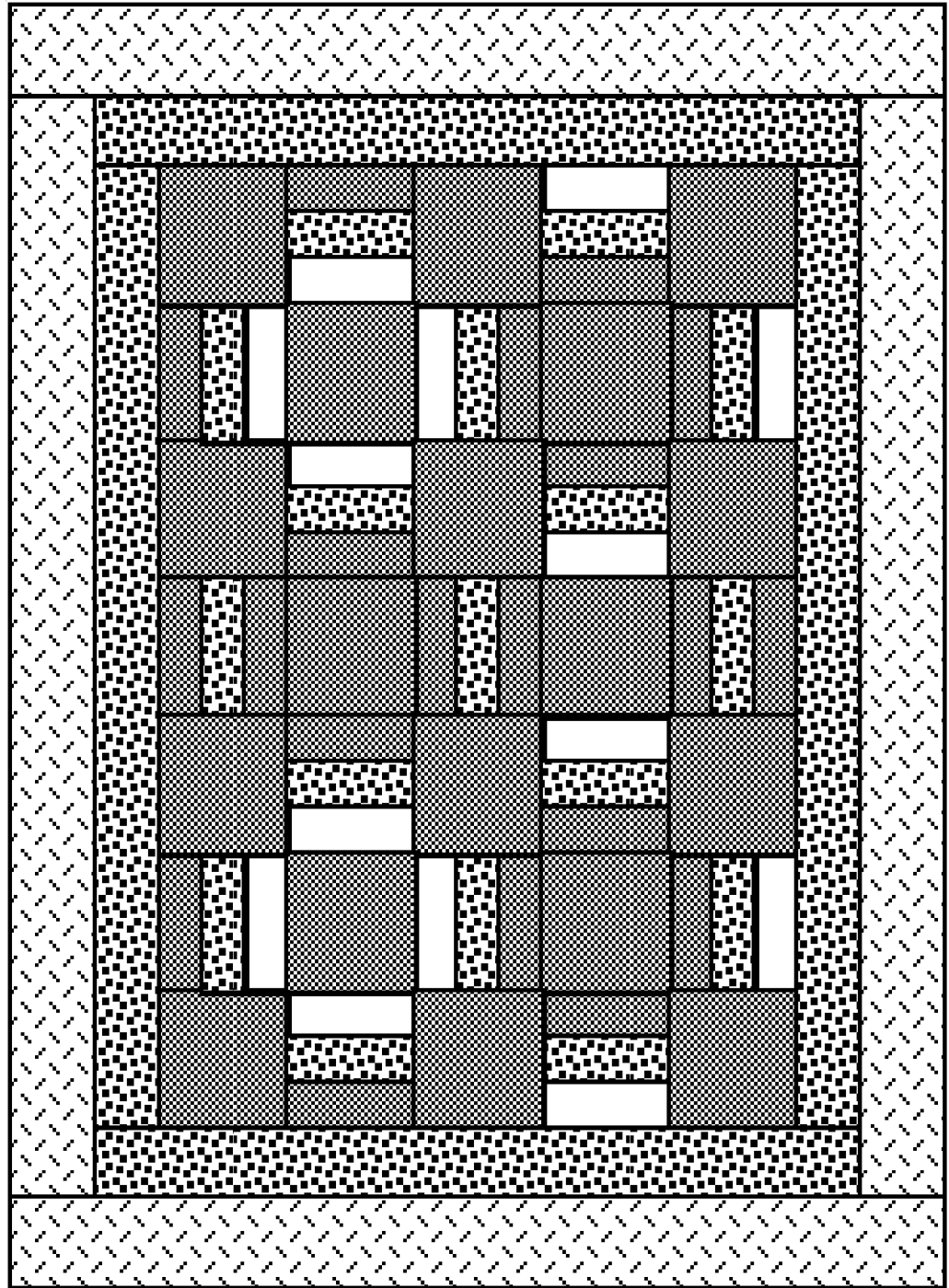


# Quilt Outreach City Park Quilt Crib

35 Blocks  
Finished quilt size: 44" by 56"  
Block layout: 5 by 7  
Finished block size: 6"  
Finished borders: 3" and 4" on each side  
Seam allowance: 1/4"  
Stitch size: 12 stitches per inch

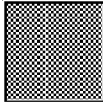


## Each kit contains:

- For Block X: 15 blocks (6-1/2" square) of Fabric A
- For Block Y: 3 strips (2-1/2" by 42") of Fabric A  
3 strips (2-1/2" by 42") of Fabric B  
3 strips (2-1/2" by 42") of Fabric C
- For Block Z: 3 blocks (6-1/2" square) of Fabric C
- Border: 5 strips (3-1/2" by 42") of border Fabric D  
5 strips (4-1/2" by 42") of border Fabric E

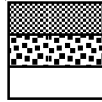
## Block Designs

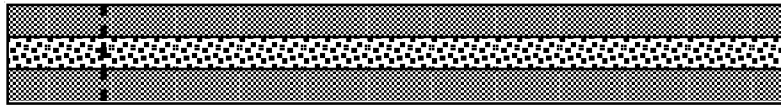

## Assembly Instructions

Block Y:

1. Sew the 2-1/2" strips of Fabrics A, B, and C together as shown below.



2. Press the seam allowances toward the darker fabric on each set of strips.
3. Cut each strip into 6-1/2"-wide units. Each unit should measure 6-1/2" square.

## Sewing the Quilt Top Together

To assemble the quilt top, sew the blocks together, following the design layout in Figure 1. Note that Rows 1 and 5 are identical; Rows 2 and 6 are identical; Rows 3 and 7 are identical.

## Adding the Border

1. For the first border, trim the selvages off the Fabric D border strips and sew the strips together, forming one long border strip.
2. Add the side borders by measuring the sides of the quilt top and cutting the border strips to size. Pin each border strip to the sides of the quilt top, starting at each end and center point, then in between, avoiding any puckering around the pins. Stitch the border. Press.
3. Repeat Step 2 for the top and bottom borders.
4. Using Fabric E, repeat Steps 1-3 to add the second border.

## Finishing the Quilt

1. Lay out the batting. Spread the backing right side up on the batting. Spread the quilt top right side down on the backing.
2. Pin around all the sides, leaving a 12" opening in the middle of one long side.
3. Trim the backing and batting to match the quilt top.
4. Stitch the layers together using a 1/2" seam allowance. Make sure to leave the 12" opening unsewn.
5. Turn the quilt with right side out by rolling it up and pulling the right side through the opening.
6. Pin the opening closed and topstitch the edge twice—first 1/4" & then 3/4" from the outside edge.
7. Machine quilt the border, if desired (this makes a sturdier quilt). Tie the quilt.
